

Pregnancy Study

This health facility is hosting a study to learn more about pregnancy outcomes in this region.

What are participants asked to do?



- Have study visits every three months while pregnant and within a few days after delivery.
- Attend visits with their babies at 3- and 6-months following birth. These visits can occur at home, if preferred.
- Provide information about their pregnancy, health, and receive an antenatal ultrasound, HIV, and syphilis testing.
- Provide information about their babies' health and allow the babies to have health exams.
- Allow study staff to review their medical records to have complete and accurate health information.
- Receive referrals for care for themselves and their babies.

Does being in the study cost anything?

No, there is no cost to participate in the study. The study staff will reimburse participants for their time and effort, and cost of trips to come for visits.

What is the risk of joining the study?

The risks of this study are small. Participants may be anxious about receiving their test results. They may feel uncomfortable answering some questions about their and their baby's health. Others may find out about the research study and may treat participants or their babies poorly or unfairly.

What are the benefits?

Pregnant participants and their babies will have access to some health exams, tests, and care referrals. This study does not replace antenatal or other health care for participants or babies. Being in the study will help provide more information about the outcomes of pregnancy in this area.

Is the study voluntary?

The risks of this study are small. Participants may be anxious about receiving their test results. They may feel uncomfortable answering some questions about their and their baby's health. Others may find out about the research study and may treat participants or their babies poorly or unfairly.
